

ABSTRACT

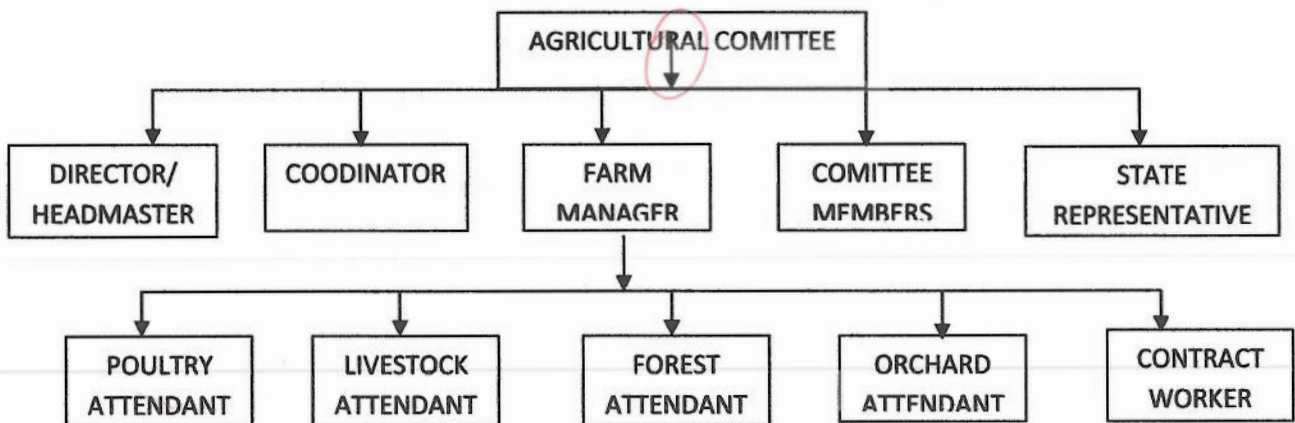
1.1 BACKGROUND
