## **CHAPTER ONE**

### **1.0 INTRODUCTION**

The industrial training was carried out from the 28th of Feb to the 27<sup>th</sup> of April at Dabani Sub county under the supervision of the Agriculture officer of the sub county.

### **1.2 BACKGROUND OF LUMINO SUBCOUNTY**

#### **1.2.0 LOCATION**

DabaniSub County is one of the fourteen sub counties found in Busia district. It's located in the central part of the district at 3km in samia Bugwe County with area coverage of 91km<sup>2</sup>.

Dabani Sub County is bordered in the north by Dabani Sub County, Republic of Kenya in the east, Masaba Sub County in the south, BuyangaSub County in west

#### **1.2.1 POPULATION**

DabaniSub County has a bigger population of over 11,670 people by the census results, but as the 2014 Uganda and housing census, the figure stands at 9939 people with 5306 male against 4633 females. The sub county has 4 parishes namely; Dabani, Municiple, Buwanda and Maanga comprising of 43 villages.

#### **1.2.2 HEALTH**

DabaniSub County currently has one health centre three in Dabani and two health centre in Bukalikha parish and FOC-REV ministries health centre.

There is one private dispensary owned by the catholic mission known as our lady of Lourdes within the mission premises located in Dabani parish.

Therefore this implies that the four parishes have access to medical services available within the sub county.

#### **1.2.3 ECONOMIC ACTIVITIES**

The people of the sub county are involved in subsistence farming where crops like cassava, maize, millet, sweet potatoes etc are grown.

The sub county has a market with numerous trading centres where most shopping is done.
