ABSTRACT

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CHAPTER ONE

Introduction

Organisation background

RALNUC agricultural units-Kitgum and Lamwo (RAU-Kitgum and Lamwo) is a unit established to implement the programme: Recovery and development in northern Uganda (RDNUC), which is one of the components of u-growth2 programme funded by Danida through the royal Danish embassy. RDNUC is a 4years programme (from 2015-2018) implemented in Acholi sub region under the name RALNUC 3. The RALNUC3 is aligned to Go U's peace recovery and development plan for northern Uganda (PRDP) and national development plan (NDP). RALNUC3 supports PRDP'S strategic objective 3 about revitalization of the economy. RALNUC3 has an immediate development objective: "To increase resilience and create equitable participation of northern Uganda in the economic development of the country".

The programme has three intervention areas and these are: agricultural production and marketing (APM), rural infrastructure (RI), and district capacity building (DCB). APM had been implemented by Kitgum district farmers association and later taken over in June, 2016 by RALNUC agricultural unit Kitgum. APM main target is "increasing average value of agricultural production for all participating farmers by 25% over a three years period". The programme implements activities in all sub counties of Kitgum District, and support production and marketing of three strategic crops: maize, sesame and sunflower.

The intervention has a number of outputs namely: output1-farmer groups trained in good agricultural practices, output2-groups supported in post-harvest handling, output3-farmers supported in collective marketing, output4-farmer groups supported to form VSLA, output5-farmer groups supported in animal traction and output6 IP capacity strengthened.

Throughout the industrial training, we the intern students were attached to the project field based staff. These were the agricultural extension officers, animal traction officers, VSLA officers, agricultural extension supervisors and animal traction supervisors. The field based staff were the immediate mentors/supervisors for the students.
