## **ABSTRACT**

The study was carried out with the aim of finding out air transport on tourism development a case study of Entebbe international airport in Wakiso district. The objectives for the study was; To find out the role of terminal building on tourism development, to find out the role of parking space on tourism development and to find out the role of runways on tourism development. The researcher applied both qualitative and quantitative techniques in designing the research. A total of 30 respondents participated in the study and were selected using convenience sampling and random sampling method. The data was collected using questionnaires and interviews and presented using tables, graphs and pie charts for easy analysis.

The study cited tourism development as source of employment, source of government revenue, and they are the major source of foreign exchange earners in most part of the world .The industry is one of the most important sectors of a nation's economy as they provide and create jobs, especially during times of holidays (summer break); they are a source of innovation and entrepreneurial spirit; they harness individual creative effort; and they create competition and are the seed bed for businesses of the future

The study also highlighted negative and positive effect of air transport on tourism development. It relied on content analysis from the existing studies, and the outcome revealed that tourism infrastructures like air transport is inimical and constitutes to tourism development.

It was however recommended that since tourism development plays a great role towards community livelihoods the government should lay strategies in order to improve on the sustainability and growth of the tourism activities and livelihoods of the local communities

It was also recommended that the government develops different strategies such as formation of tourism association, formation of ministry of tourism and wildlife antiquity, exempting some tourism establishment from paying taxes and looking for investors to invest in the sectors and others and promote the industry.

# **CHAPTER ONE**

## **BACKGROUND OF THE STUDY**

### **1.0 Introduction**

This chapter presents the introduction, background of the study, problem statement, purpose of the study, objectives, research questions, scope of the study, conceptual framework, significance of the study, and definitions of key terms.

### **1.1 Background of study**

Air transport refers to the movement of tourist and cargo by air craft like airplanes and helicopters. Air transport has made it easy for tourists to travel to different destinations and leading to an increase in tourism receipts. In 2019 air transport contributed to 1.5b us dollars, direct employment of 19.6m people in airport hotels air service and a total of 44.8m jobs and 1billion us dollars in the world GDP [ATAG 2020].

According to (Thesis, 2023), Governments worldwide have taken initiatives to increase the development of tourism and hospitality in the different parts of the world like improvement of transport system and others but still tourism and hospitality industry development is a big challenge hence encouraging the researcher to investigate the contribution of air transport on the development of tourism and hospitality in Uganda by using Entebbe international airport as a case study.

Globally, (UNWTO 2022), in Geneva-Switzerland indicated that the tourism sector had experienced six decades of almost constant growth and diversification as a result of modernization of international airports like Zurich international airport, Geneva international airport. In 2019, the tourism sector led to contribution of US\$8 trillion tourist travel to Switzerland economy, representing 10.4% of gross domestic product (GDP). Growth in travel and tourism continued to outpace most other economic sectors, with GDP growth of 3.5% in 2019, behind only information and communication and financial services. Lugano international airport accounted for 8% of total exports and 27.4% of global services exports. International tourism of airport continued to expand beyond long-term growth forecasts with 1.5 billion international tourist arrivals in 2019. Nevertheless, domestic tourism remained the key driver of the tourism sector globally, accounting for 71.7% of travel and tourism spending, with international tourism accounting for the remaining 28.3%.
