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

1.3 BACK GROUND OF SOROTI CITY.

Growth dates back to 1904 when district commissioner of Mbale sent Kakungulu to open up some administration posts in Serere Gweri, Soroti areas part of the Kakungulu team camped near the rock of Soroti and settled there the choice of the camp site probably influenced by good drinking water from nearby streams and the fact that the rocks had some advantages

The local inhabitants were forced to clear the forest and with few years a large area had been cleared and considerable amount of settlement had taken place thatched houses for administrative purposes of Soroti county were put stands, the dispensaries at now Soroti hospital

Later when the Asians came small shops for trade ware raised up in Soroti and batter trade started

In 1912 Soroti became permanent headquarters of Teso region as a result of the recommendation by Sir Frederick Jackson who was pointed new governor of Uganda

Later the district commissioner was posted to Soroti permanent buildings then started with the district office, when the first world war came in 1914 -1918 the development somewhat went down in 1919 it again picked up

SOROTI CITY attained its city status in 2020 and it was divided in to two divisions EASTERN AND WESTERN division with each division having its wards and cells respectively for easy delivery of service and leadership i.e., Pamba, OPUYO, Moruapesur,
