

## **ABSTRACT**

Outreach is always conducted in Busitema university faculty of agriculture and animal science, Arapai campus by the second year semester one continuing students of CGA, DCP and DAP, as one of the modules in the semester for a partial fulfillment of an award of a certificate in general agriculture, and Diploma in crop and animal production and management.

## **1.0 CHAPTER ONE: INTRODUCTION**

### **1.1 back ground of the outreach program**

Outreach is a university program in Busitema University Arapai Campus which has to be assigned to every continuing student of CGA, DCP, and DAP in the first semester of the second academic year of study to preferably undergo the training on the selected farmers of the nearby homes around the campus to put classroom knowledge into practice and at the same time to write the report. The outreach report is about research on the various sections and activities carried at the farmers home or farm., the activity took a period of 11 weeks which was from 2<sup>nd</sup> September - 11<sup>th</sup> November -2019.

### **1.2 objectives of outreach**

Aims at improving agriculture, livestock production and business development in selected farmers homes or farms. Key interventions will also include improving hygiene and sanitation, widen the student theory knowledge into more practical skills and to build the students confidentiality.

### **1.3 description of outreach area**

Outreach was carried out in ALOET ZONE B by Group Two Members in a home of Miss APISO CAROLINE the farmer allocated to us who was an old woman who had only her son's wife staying with her grandchildren. The old woman had only half an acre of groundnuts garden and some cassava plantation, five banana plants, two orange trees with one sheep and one goat. The daughter in law was over loaded by work because she was the only person helping the old woman.
