Communal land of about 200 hectares were given out by the community people where the SBDI was found.

Modern practical applications at SBDI included irrigation, green house production, tractor operation, seedling nursery management, tree planting as well as making of accessible roads in the community. These were meant to give skills and knowledge among the beneficiaries and the community people. so that they can sustain themselves with and kill poverty.

From the selected beneficiaries, a few were selected and trained all the agricultural practices so named artisans in different projects such as livestock, apiary, vegetable and fruit growing tree planting, open field.

The artisans were trained enough also to train other beneficiaries. and community people the agricultural practices
